Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is a great privilege to write this newsletter and provide you a report of the mission in the land of Haiti. Before proceeding, I want to thank everyone of you faithful friends and supporters. I am very thankful for your support, both financial and spiritual. Haiti needs prayer more than ever before!

According to the latest communications, several of the police specialists were killed in an ambush last week. They were sent into a set-up in which all communication was cut off from the police department and no one came to their rescue. Please pray for peace and security in Haiti. There are so many of us who wish to travel to Haiti, but it is simply unsafe at this time. There are kidnappings everywhere in the capital and there are barricades erected in the suburbs across different sections of the city. According to the news, it has never been so bad.

Church and School

The church meetings are being held regularly. However, for the people's safety, there is only one scheduled meeting on Sunday and the nightly gatherings meet earlier and conclude earlier than usual. Thank God for the continued freedom to worship the Lord!

The children are attending school daily with the addition of safety measures. So far, there have been no cases of Covid-19 reported in our school, nor from the Assembly. Last month, we had a fellowship meeting during which several churches gathered at the Bozoton #55 location. There were several hundred brothers and sisters attending the meeting but the Holy Spirit was there to bless and protect His people. We had a grand time in the Lord! Thank the Lord, no one has gotten sick so far. We are very prayerful for safety from the pandemic.

Clinics

The clinics are open to care for individuals from the neighborhood and the church. The clinics continue to provide first aid until the patient can get to a hospital. Everything is running smoothly at the present time. Thank you so much for your support!

Please keep my family and Haiti in your prayers. It has been a difficult and insecure time for us all. I am going to stop for now. Until next time, may God bless you. Be safe!
